Larry Deagon, 67, lives in Birmingham Alabama with his wife Jane. He received his Master of Music degree from Northwestern University in 1953, Now retired (almost) Larry was a member of the Birmingham Symphony, a high school band director, music supervisor and a free-lance musician and conductor.

Larry can't remember a

time when he wasn't interested in trains. His grandfather was a claim agent for the Pittsburgh, Shawmutt & Northern, and his uncle worked for the Erie Railroad. He received his customary Christmas Lionel train set in the early 1930s, and by high school graduation in Toronto. Canada, he had built a large tinplate layout in the basement, inspired by the Frank Ellison articles in Model Builder Magazine.
